Fascinated by fairy tales. This taster explores the secrets behind fairy tales; who wrote them and why? We will discuss how these stories helped societies make sense of the world in which they live and how making stories suitable for a modern audience can distort or lose the original meaning, such as Disney representation of Grimm tales. There will be follow on courses including “write a modern day fairy tale for St Ives”.
